




Financial Report for the year ending December 31, 2021

The General Fund is the main operating fund of the Library. It is primarily supported by State Funding, Property Taxes, fees, donations, and interest income.


2021 Revenue




Where the Money Goes:

Funds from the General Fund are spent on Public Service and Programs, Collection Development and Processing, Facilities Operation and Maintenance, Information Services (CLEVNET), Business Administration, and Capital Outlay.

2021 Expenses



At the end of each year, funds not expended (beyond 120 days of operating expenses) are transferred into various Capital funds. These funds are used to keep our buildings, vehicles, and technology up to date and in good repair.

- Has bookmobile stops at more than 70 locations throughout the County.

- Has access to hundreds of thousands of eBooks, downloadable videos, audiobooks, and music.
- Provides access to premier research databases including, Ancestry*, Business Source Premier, Chilton, Consumer Reports, Ebscohost, Gale Legal Forms, Heritage Quest, LinkedIn Learning, Morningstar Investment Center *in library use only.
- Provides online access to The Daily Record and other Ohio and national newspapers.
- Checks out nontraditional items such as: WiFi Hotspots, Chromebooks, 3D printers, cake pans and cookie cutters, games, toys, and more!
- Provides free WiFi and computers for public use in all our buildings.
- Provides services to multiple outreach sites including: schools, nursing homes, preschools, and daycares.
- Provides Home Delivery Service to those who are temporarily or permanently unable to visit our library locations.
