Library Lego League

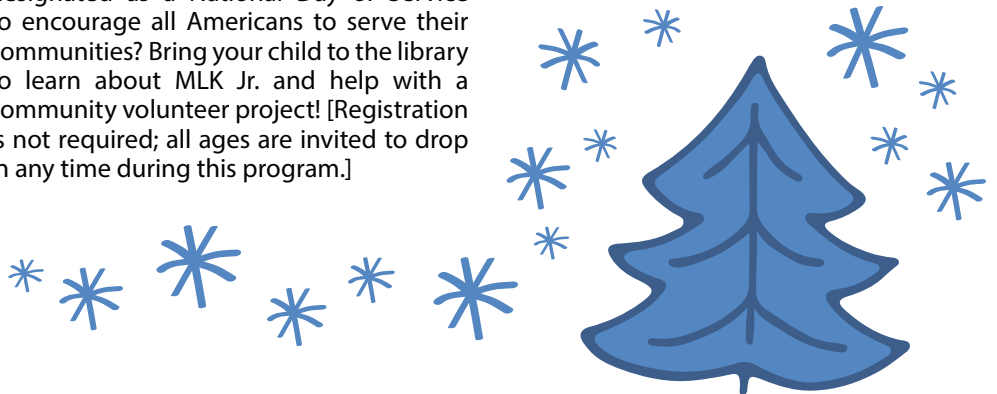
Tuesday, January 17 from 4:30 to 5:30 PM
